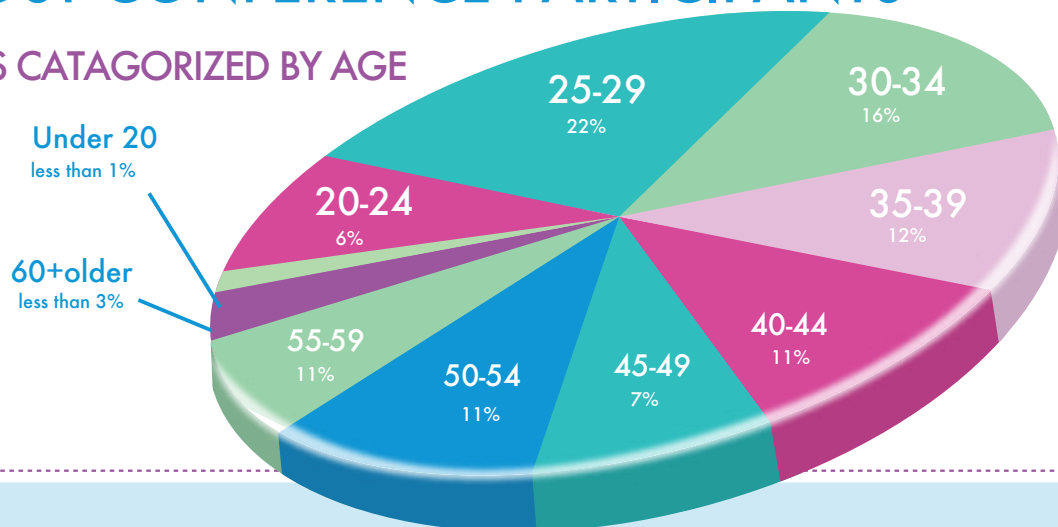

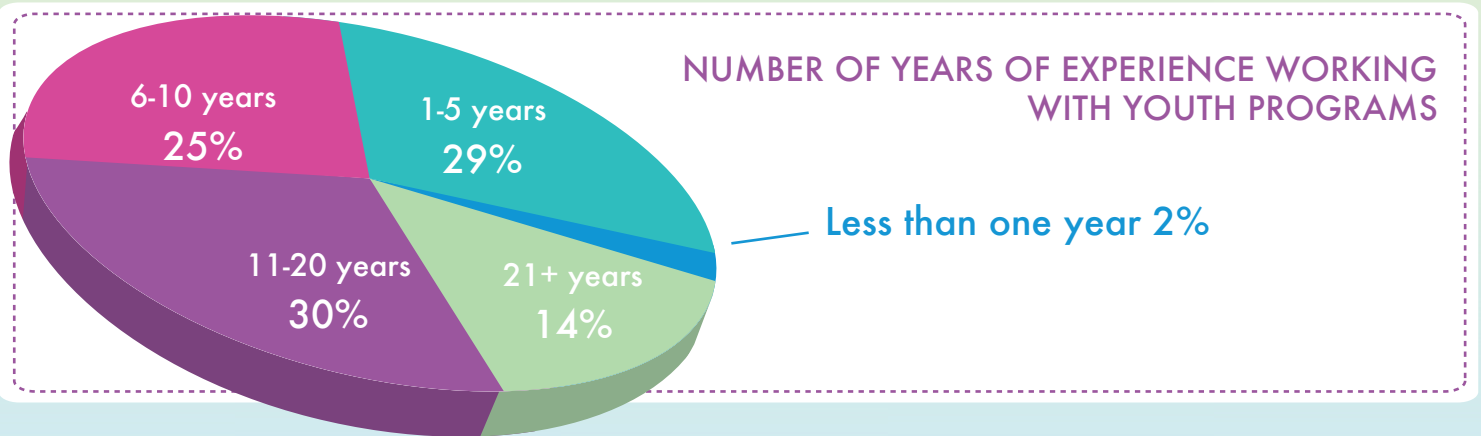
### PARTICIPANTS CATAGORIZED BY AGE



### PARTICIPANTS CATAGORIZED BY HIGHEST LEVEL OF EDUCATION

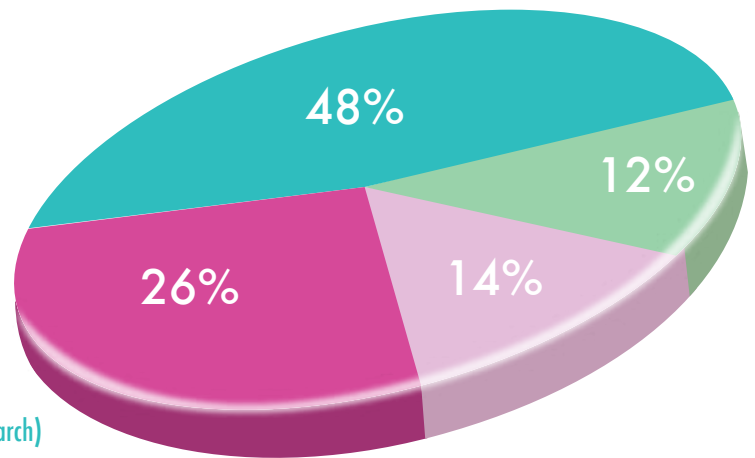


# THE BOOST CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS

- 26%** **Upper-Level Administration**  
(Manage an organization, manage a budget, fundraise and/or work with a governing board)
- 48%** **Mid-Level Administration**  
(Manage/Direct one or more program sites)
- 14%** **Direct Service**  
(Work directly with children/youth)
- 12%** **Capacity-Building**  
(Provide professional development, technical assistance, monitor programs, evaluate programs, and/or conduct research)



**74%** Work with one or more youth programs

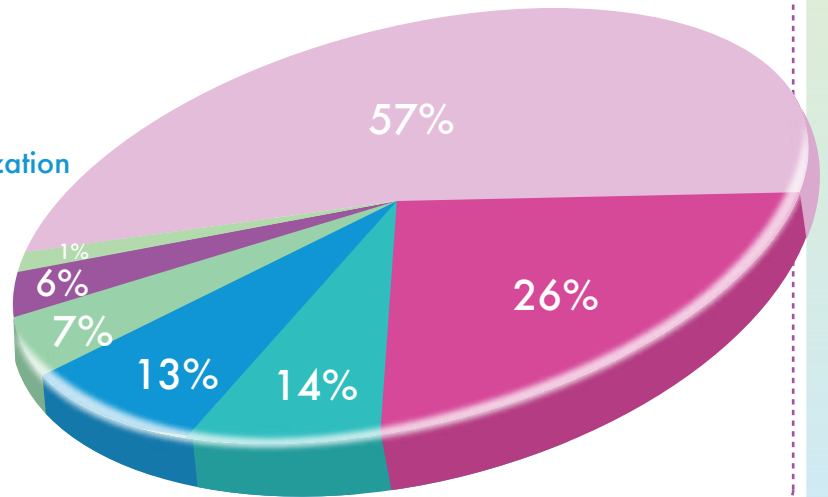
**67%** Work Full-Time (35 hours/week or more)
